**School Directory** - The options of the WCPSS Print Shop and Office Max were considered for printing after the "opt outs" were deleted and the student artwork selected (Erin Choplin and Ashleigh Pippen's artwork appear on the front and back covers). Office Max was chosen because of their service and efficiency; the costs were comparable. The directories were completed, picked up and delivered to the school on Friday Sept. 29th. The cost was \$1572.90. They were distributed during 2nd period to the students on October 25, 2006. Last year when they were printed in our SHS print shop the cost was \$481.41; well below our \$1000.00 budget. The average cost per year for the last two years was \$1027. We were very pleased to have reached our goal of having the directories printed and available for distribution before the end of September; much sooner than the 2005-2006 school year when they were not available until February .
